Priest's Message

On Maundy Thursday we commemorated the Last Supper of Jesus and his institution of Holy Communion. The mood of Maundy Thursday is a reflective and sombre one, anticipating the crucifixion on Good Friday. In the 13th Century St Thomas Aquinas suggested to Pope Urban IV a feast day to celebrate the joy of Holy Communion. Accordingly a feast day was set on the Thursday or Sunday after Trinity Sunday. This feast day is also kept by the Western Orthodox, Lutheran and Anglican Churches.



Anglican worship in many churches focusses solely on the Eucharist (or Holy Communion). This is a more recent development. One hundred years ago, Matins and Evensong were the more popular services, starting and ending Sundays. People may have attended Holy Communion perhaps monthly or so. However the liturgical revival of the early Twentieth Century in the Anglican Church brought a renewed focus on the Eucharist.

Having said that, the shape of our Communion service is very ancient. Chapter 14 of The Didache (a First Century Christian document) states: "But every Lord's day gather yourselves together, and break bread, and give thanksgiving after having confessed your transgressions." It also suggests prayers for blessing the cup, the bread and a prayer after communion. The shape of our Eucharist is even older with the Ministry of the Word being based on Jewish Synagoge worship and the Communion part being based on the practice of early Jewish Christians, who would meet in the synagogue first and then return to a home to break bread together.

For two thousand years followers of Jesus have drawn strength, hope, comfort, inspiration, peace and joy from sharing Communion together. Today we give thanks for this wonderful lasting gift that Jesus has left us.

They then disputed among themselves, saying, 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' So Jesus said to them, 'Very truly, I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day; for my flesh is true

food and my blood is true drink. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them. Just as the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever eats me will live because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like that which your ancestors ate, and they died. But the one who eats this bread will live for ever.'


Rev. Tracey Gracey. Grazing food and tea/coffee will be available throughout the day. Stay for the entire time or just a while—everyone is welcome. RSVP
